Professor Gábor Hamza is a distinguished Professor of Civil (Roman) Law at the ELTE University of Budapest. He is also the President of the Civil Law and Comparative Law Section of the Academy of European Law, a listed arbitrator of the Budapest Chamber of Commerce Arbitration Center, and editor-in-chief as well as member of the editorial councils of several legal periodicals.

Professor Hamza has an extensive research and publication list: he has written 20 books, and written or contributed to 1213 volumes, articles and review articles on Roman law, legal history, comparative law, EU law, legal philosophy and constitutional law. Today he gives lectures in 7 languages in various countries across 5 continents
